## BABCOCK LIBRARY Request for Book Censure

Challenging a book is the attempt to ban a book from a library, school district, institution, organization, government entity, retailer, or publisher based on its content. Challenges can either result in the book being banned or they can be overturned and the book remains in circulation at the organization.

The freedom to read, along with the freedom to hear and to view, is protected by the First Amendment to the U. S. Constitution and shall not be restricted or abridged based on the content or viewpoint expressed in the materials in the Babcock Library collection.

## Procedures:

- The book (or other library material) must have been read in full by you.
- Only one form from a household is accepted at a time.
- To submit a book (or other library material) to consider for censure from Babcock Library requires the full completion of the questions on this form by the individual who or the group that is making the submission.
- The fully completed form must be returned to the Babcock Public Library.
- The Babcock Library Board of Trustees will review the specified book and make a decision within six weeks from date of receiving the completed book challenge form.

 The decision as to ban or not ban a book from the library is conducted solely by the governing Babcock Library Board of Library Trustees. Their final decision is binding.
